

About the rescue mission

Within a Palestinian partnership, the Japanese organization Frontline announced a rescue mission in the Gaza Strip, in light of the ongoing war, in partnership with the Nafs for Empowerment and with the support of the Japanese people and the Japana platform

The rescue mission is divided into a number of programs

- A psychological first aid program for children in the Gaza Strip, which our organization implements in the Gaza office in partnership with Nafs Foundation for Empowerment, where the team conducts direct and group workshops with children who were forcibly displaced with their families to UNRWA schools in the city of Rafah, south of the Gaza Strip
- Providing health and food support to Abu Youssef Al-Najjar Hospital in Rafah, which suffers from a severe shortage of all medical supplies, including health personnel, in light of the large overcrowding of displaced people in the city of Rafah, which has negatively affected the ability of the collapsed health sector to provide services

- Our team continues to work dedicatedly and has continued since the beginning of the war on the Gaza Strip through direct implementation with children and in the largest Ono schools in the city of Rafah in the south of the Gaza Strip, which has been transformed since the beginning of the war
- Children participate in our activities in large groups, estimated at 100 to 250 children, within a weekly plan developed by the team that ensures the effective participation of children in order to alleviate the severity of the psychological traumas they are exposed to during the war



Support the health sector



- Within the framework of the rescue mission, the team provided the first batch of food parcels to the injured and sick inside Abu Youssef Al-Najjar Hospital in very difficult conditions. The team succeeded in preparing the parcels despite the ongoing siege and the ongoing closure of markets, and the goods ran out due to the war and siege.
- Our team is constantly striving to prepare the first batch of medicines that will be provided to Abu Youssef Al-Najjar Hospital, as according to our follow-up, the hospital is suffering from a severe shortage of medicine and working medical personnel due to the intensity of its targeting and the huge numbers of displaced people in the city of Rafah.

Medicine and food



We are doing everything we can to continue providing support to Abu Youssef Al-Najjar Hospital (medicine and food) within the framework of the rescue mission implemented by the Japanese frontline Foundation in partnership with the Nafs for empowerment organizations, while we call the world to intervene immediately and urgently to save the collapsed Palestinian health sector as a result of the ongoing war on the sector Gaza
